Gymnastics

Throughout the term, Year 2 have been developing and strengthening their skills in Gymnastics. In pairs and small groups, the children have been working towards a final performance that included the use of balances, ways of travelling, jumps and stretches. They used a variety of apparatus as well as the mats for floor work. Over the term, their control and presentations have developed and their final performances were excellent!

Mathematics.

As mathematicians, we have been learning about multiplication and division and have ended our unit with practicing and learning our 2, 5 and 10 times table, alongside the related division facts. The children have developed their understanding of making equal groups, repeated addition, grouping and sharing to support them in their understanding. It has been brilliant to hear that some children are already going onto TT Rockstars to practice their times tables too.

Science

Our unit this half term has been all about 'animas and humans' and we have started our off by learning about animals and their off spring, life cycles and recapping about how to categorise different animals. As part of our learning, we have adopted some little caterpillars, which have given us an opportunity to observe how they change and grow over time. Over the holidays, I will continue to post pictures onto our class photo page to show the children how they have been progressing. We hope to see the final stages of growth when we return to school. As part of our learning about different groups of animals, we invited 'Animal Interactive' into school so we could experience real animals from these groups.
