Welcome to Year 5 and our curriculum updates! It's been a great start to the year and lovely to see some familiar parents and some new ones as well. Our first theme of the year is all about North America, thinking especially about its Geography and History. We have already been looking at the area using maps and atlases, and recognising countries, states, cities and landmarks. In addition, we have started to learn about the 'discovery' of America by Columbus, the Vikings and that the Native Americans were already there anyway. In Forest School, we extended this learning to build our own tipis and dreamcatchers. We have also been looking at the work of American artist, Jackson Pollock and his unique, abstract pieces of work. Starting off by thinking about how we can represent feelings and emotions through lines, we have progressed and started experimenting with different colours and materials. At Forest School, they all worked on their own group piece using natural resources.
