Operation Intelligence

During the last few weeks, the class have worked incredibly hard and have pushed themselves in everything that they have done whether it has been learning to use six-figure grid references when map reading, writing lyrics in music or developing their drama skills. As writers, they have written a newspaper report based on a short Sherlock Holmes mystery, which was set in Hereford, and they have continued to develop their creative writing skills through "short burst" tasks. This week, the children have been writing a magazine style interview using the information they found out from Sergeant Lewis, who visited the classroom last week to discuss life as a detective. STAR Programme - West Mercia Police

Hopefully you have already heard some details about the sessions with Anna, a PCSO from West Mercia Police, where the children discussed five key areas: legal drugs, illegal drugs, alcohol, smoking and volatile substances.

The sessions explored the dangers of each of these, suggestions on what to do if they are offered any of them and also who to talk to if they have concerns regarding any of these issues. For many, the highlight of the workshops was having a quiz to show how much they had learnt and I was extrememly pleased to see how well they all scored.





Science

As scientists, the children have been learning about our organs, the circulatory system, the digestive system, and the importance of maintaining a healthy diet and lifestyle. As part of this, they have been measuring their heart rates before and during physical activity and have also carried out an investigation into the sugar levels in different drinks and how these may affect our bodies, especially our teeth. Some children were initially quite uneasy with observing and touching the eggshells, which had been left in the various drinks for over a week, but their curiosity soon got the better of them.



Art and Maths

In maths, the children have been learning how to find the area of triangles and parallelograms and how to calculate the volume of cuboids.

Linked to this exploration of different shapes, we have also been looking at the work of the Russian artist, Wassily Kandinsky, and have created their own masterpieces inspired by his unique style.



Miss Hirst has been working with the class in designing and making prototype bug hotels in preparation for building larger structures using pallets at the legacy Growing Space next term. In addition, this last week has seen the children creating a sculpture of a red fox using chicken wire, inspired by the beautiful story, "The Lost Spells".
