
Class 3 Curriculum Update

February's Values: Simplicity and fairness






Since the beginning of this term Year 3 have been learning about Ancient Greece, in particular Athens and Sparta. We have been looking at Ancient Greek mythical beasts and gods, the city states that made up Ancient Greece and ordered some key events on a timeline. The children have also learnt about on how the Greeks used to live, including the key aspect of mythology, highlighting the concepts that characterized Ancient Greece, especially Athens and Sparta. The children know the Ancient Greek myths were stories about gods and goddesses and that Zeus was the King of the gods. They have all wrote an excellent information text about Zeus. As well as this the children have looked at the legacy of the ancient Greeks, especially the origin of the Olympic Games, the architecture of the Greek buildings and like us today, Ancient Greeks elected their leaders in a democracy, however only men could vote. At Forest School, the children have been taking part in Olympic style games.

Homework is important for practising, applying and consolidating the learning skills the children develop in school. Spelling Shed and TTRockstars (times tables practice) are the main homework the children will do in Year 3. It is expected that the children go on these every week. Two or three games per day, Monday to Friday, is great as little and often is best.

Reading. The expectation for reading in Year 3 is 10 -15 minutes a day to an adult. The adult that listens to the child read should date and intial. If your child reads an non school book that is fine. It has been great to see the children reaching their 40 reads and beyond. The children work on their comprehension skills weekly and this will continue to happen throughout the year. They also work on their fluency and expression. It is always a pleasure to read the class reader (book) to them as they do enjoy listening to a story.





Dates for your diary and reminders

Forest School sessions are every other Tuesday, although children need old, warm functional clothing every Tuesday. These can include hats and gloves. Children should have their wellies in school at all times.

PE sessions are Monday (squash) and swimming on Thursdays. This will be up until Easter, after which these will change and we will notify you. Children should come into school in their PE kits. If they have long hair, they should have a hairband to tie their hair back and tape to cover their ears if they wear earnings.
