Crazy Climate & Wacky Weather

We used the recent flooding in Herefordshire in our short burst writing for a few weeks, from creating a diary to imagine they experienced it to first hand to writing as reporters, scripting questions to interview someone who was affected by the flooding. Their engagement was clear to see. It was also a great experience for all at both Elan Valley and the Hereford Waterworks Museum. Elan Valley in particular gave the children a great understanding of weather, especially water and the journey it takes to get into our homes. But also the weather conditions on the journey to Elan Valley. The children were engaged in spotting different weather conditions (we had most!). However, the highlight was going inside of a dam, both for the children and the adults. It was great to see the children fascinated by what was inside the dam and viewing on top of the waterfall as the water raced out. It was strange to think that this water rushing out would cause so much devastation locally in the coming days.
