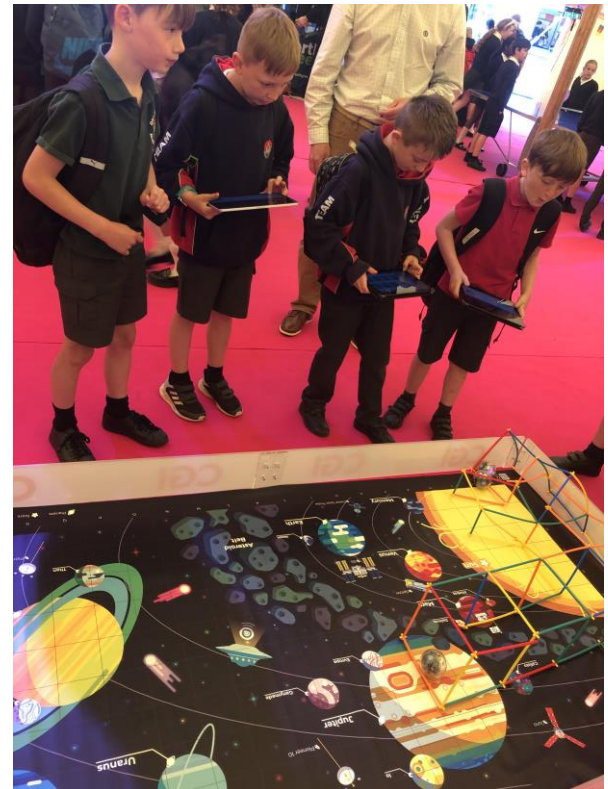
We have been encouraging the children to beat their best score and show how well they have learnt their times tables. Thank you.
