Times Tables

There has been lots of good progress with the children's times tables recall. The national multiplication check is fast approaching in June and we are working hard in class to practise daily. Your child should have their own flashcards to practise with at home and in school. Each child should have an envelope with multiplications they need to practise. As they become more confident with these, they should move into the collection of 'known' times tables.

I will be sending home more activities and games to play, in order to practise and develop your child's recall. Please ensure they bring their flashcards into school every day to practise with. Thank you.
