'In your element'

We have now come to the end of our short unit of work about the four elements s. Earth, Wind, Fire and Air. It has provided us with the opportunity to look at how powerful nature can be and some of the natural disasters that unfortunately go with these. In particular, we have studied how the movement of tectonic plates create earthquakes, famous volcanic eruptions like Vesuvius, tsunamis such as the Indian Ocean one in 2004 and on Monday we will finish off by looking at tornadoes and hurricanes. The children have all been fairly interested in learning about these and I'm sure we could have spent much longer investigating all these phenomena. We realised how fortunate we are that we don't really have any severe natural disasters like these, in our country.

Outside of our theme learning, we have continued with our flute lessons, learning 'A' and 'B' chords. Tag rugby has continued with Aiden Cheshire from Luctonians and Mr Richards has been helping the class create their own totem pole in Construction lessons! In science, the class have been investigating how to separate insoluble materials, like sand, from water. They also enjoyed creating 'irreversible changes' by mixing bicarbonate of soda and vinegar to create their own volcanoes with an eruption. There will be plenty more learning to come in the next few weeks before Christmas!
