Passion For Fashion

This term's theme is proving to be a great challenge for the children and it is opening their eyes to all aspects of fashion and design in an ever-changing world. The logo for the theme shows some of the current issues, which we will be looking at during the term, including the importance of sustainability, the rise in "fast fashion" and concerns regarding the use of cheap labour. The children will have the opportunity to work with a fashion model and a fashion designer to design and create a range of upcycled clothing using their expertise. In addition, we will be looking at how "fashion" also refers to the design of homes, buildings and even gardens. Indeed, the children have already started to do this by choosing a designer to research in their recent homework.

Science and Maths

In the last two weeks, the children have started to learn more about the work of Charles Darwin and the Theory of Evolution. They have carried out an experiment into the adaptation of finches' beaks as observed by Darwin during his time in the Galapagos Islands and have recorded their results in a line graph, building on the statistical skills they have been learning in maths.





The children have been looking at the different fashions between 1900 and 1960 and how these were influenced by events in society, such as the Suffragette Movement and the impact of World War 2 on clothing. In the next few weeks, we will be exploring the explosion of pop culture through the 60s and 70s before moving on to some of the incredible fashions that were mentioned by many of you in the children's recent interviews. I am looking forward to hearing their thoughts on RaRa skirts and shell suits!




Art

Having studied the work of Darwin in Science, we have also been discussing the importance of observational drawing and taking time to practise these skills in class. First, the children drew a selection of fossils and then they used copies of drawings made by Darwin himself.
