"I Have a Dream" - Building Tolerance

Throughout this half-term, Year 6 will be building on their work from Years 4 and 5 by looking at the injustices and discrimination facing people of different colour during two specific periods in history: North America in the 1960's and South Africa during the years of Apartheid. As part of this work, the children will examine the work and lives of two incredible activists and orators, Martin Luther King and Nelson Mandela.

The theme will also build on the work regarding Diversity, which the children explored in September with the Drama Geezers and relates specifically to the Values that we discuss regularly in school of tolerance, fairness and kindness.

Towards the end of the theme, the children will write their own speech about something that they feel strongly about and will have the opportunity to persuade and inspire others with their words.

Science - Electrical circuits

At the end of last half-term, the children visited Fairfield High School, where Mrs Kerr set them a variety of activities related to how they set up and changed the components within a circuit. The class thoroughly enjoyed this opportunity to work in the science lab and successfully completed all the challenges that they were set.
