"A World of Bright Ideas" & Enterprise

We are well on our way with our first theme of the year, which focuses on the history of inventions, and I am looking forward to seeing what the children have chosen to research for their homework. In the next few weeks, we will be looking at the role of patenting and copyright and how this affects businesses.

Our Enterprise project runs throughout the year and gives the children the opportunity to put their own design and creative skills to the test as they become "young entrepreneurs". This year the children have applied to be part of a specific group, focusing on developing different aspects of design and technology skills: textiles, construction and food technology/cooking. As well as learning what makes a successful business, the children will also have the chance to find out how some local businesses have adapted to the challenges of the past few years, either through visits to companies, visitors to school or through the use of technology such as Zoom and Teams. More information about this exciting project will follow in the next few weeks.

Science

This half-term, the children will be building on their understanding of electrical circuits. They will have the opportunity to build different circuits and will also be finding out about some of the major developments in the history of electricity. They will also learn about the difference between AC and DC electricity and the "Current Wars".
