### **Values: Unity and Friendship**

The children have all made a great start to the year and we are delighted with the progress and determination that they have already shown in meeting the challenges and opportunities that they have been given.

## **Madley Enterprise**

For our theme this term, we are thinking about what it means to be a business. The class have been split up into five small groups with each one having a different type business. Each group has already decided on their company name, the business ethics that they want to abide by, and what they want to produce.

During a fantastic "branding" workshop with Mark White for Pizza hut, each group created a mood board with their ideas on how they are going to attract customers and later this week, David Cash, a Director with Barclays Bank, will be advising the children on business finance and how to put a realistic business plan together before they face a "Dragons Den" scenario.

Throughout the term, the children will have the opportunity to meet a number of different entrepreneurs and business managers, either in school or during small group visits. These visits started last week with a fascinating morning at Madley Plants, where Michelle Blackmore shared some of her experiences of setting up a business in Madley and one group also visited Certainly Wood in Lulham, coming away with a greater understanding of how to develop products for specific customers. Indeed, all of the visits give the children a wonderful opportunity to develop their awareness of what it takes for a business to succeed and to gain ideas for their own enterprise groups and we are very grateful for the support of all those involved with the project.







#### Parent helpers and support

Whilst is important that the children understand the hard work that is involved in making their products, if you are able to assist them in any way either in school or from home, with sewing, baking, crafts or woodwork, then please let me know. We would also ask that you do not "buy" materials specifically for the groups as they need to realise the true cost of their products, however donations, such as those that we have already requested, are very much appreciated.

#### "The Tempest"

The children have all been involved in writing their own adaptation of the story and are now busy rehearsing as much they possibly can. Please encourage your child to learn their lines as needed and don't forget to book your tickets for this unique interpretation and experience.

#### Homework

Homework is important for practicing and applying the skills that are being developed in school. Weekly homework will therefore be given on a Monday to be handed in on Friday.

**Maths** – a sheet of maths questions that will allow the children to practice arithmetic skills.

**English** — this may be a grammar activity to practice a skill, a spelling focus or, occasionally, a longer writing task.

If your child is unable to complete their homework or needs additional time, please encourage them to attend homework club, which takes place every Wednesday lunchtime.

#### **40** Reads
