Spring Term 1

Welcome back and a very Happy New Year. It has been a very busy and exciting start to the Spring term! This half term we have been looking at the theme The Arctic Circle.

Mathematics.

In maths this term, we have been furthering our understanding of money. We have been looking at different coins and notes and understanding the differences in their values. We transformed our classroom into a shop and used our money skills to pay for items as well as giving the correct change.

Next week we will move onto our new unit of multiplication and division. We will start by recapping making and recognising equal groups and using arrays to represent equal groups.

Science.

As scientists we have been looking at the theme 'animals including humans.' We looked at different mother animals and decided whether their offspring looks like its parents or not. We have also been looking at life cycles of butterflies and the human life cycle.

Next week we will be discovering what humans and animals need to survive.

In our theme we have been looking at where in the world the Arctic Circle is and what the conditions are like there. We have discovered that many different animals, plants and even humans live there. We also looked at how they have adapted to live in the harsh conditions.

We took our exploration of The Arctic to Malvern! Where the children participated in an ice-skating session and got to experience firsthand what it may be like to live in an Arctic Climate.

Next week we will be discovering what and how global warming has affected The Arctic and how Inuits live today.

As artists we have been exploring the theme of architecture. We have looked at the artist Friedensreich Hundertwasser. We have used oil pastels to create some building inspired pictures. Next week we will be using 3D materials to create our own buildings.
