Hello all!

Reading books and reading at home.

I can only apologise for this and to ensure that we have consistency across the school I can confirm that children in Year 1 will now bring their books back on a **Friday** so that we can quarantine them over the weekend and send them home with your children again on a **Monday**.

Lunchtimes in Year 1

As you may be aware, Year 1 have their lunch in the classroom and the children have settled into this routine brilliantly. At lunch times in Year 1, we will be focusing on our table manners a lot more. We will be practising to hold and use both our knife and fork, sit at our tables sensibly on our chairs correctly, with legs under the table. We will also be taking responsibility for clearing our own plates and helping to tidy our classroom after we have had our lunch. The children have already made a great to start to this! Well done Year 1!

Fruit

At first, we were unsure as to whether the fruit would start again this term but we have had our first few deliveries and the children are now able to have access to the fruit from school. They are still more than welcome to bring in their own snack but please can we ensure that it is a fruit snack or a healthy snack choice.

Theme

Within our first week back, Year 1 worked together to decide on what they would like to focus on in their learning this term. As a class, they wanted to learn about the human body, how it works and how to look after it. This term, are theme is called 'Amazing Me'.

We have already made a great start to the theme by looking at different parts of the body and reading the story Funny Bones' as inspiration for our writing and other areas of the curriculum. Every morning the children also do 10 minutes of exercise as part of their theme for learning about how to stay fit and healthy.

<u>Marvellous Me</u>

Marvellous Me is an opportunity for the children to share some special items from home. This opportunity encourages the children to develop: listening skills, questioning skills, confidence and trust amongst their peers. As a school, we know this is something that the children really value therefore we endeavour to continue to allow this to take place this year with new safety measures and precautions in place. To ensure that there is no cross contamination between home and school, only the box will come home. The child should then fill the box with their special things and return it to school with a plastic bag. After sharing their special things, the child will then put them into their plastic bag and take them straight home. The box will then be cleaned and wiped and quarantined for at least 72 hours before going home with another child. Within the classroom, the child will not be able pass around their special items only show them to their friends.
