Homework

Please keep practising all spellings using either Spellingshed or homework books. TTrockstars provides great practise too. The data shows that children who use it regularly find it positively influences their reading writing and maths abilities.

Reading for 10-15 minutes a day should similarly be prioritised as it helps a child's reading, spellings and writing ability. This is probably the single biggest thing you can do to help your child develop. The more enjoyable you can make it, the more they are likely to want to read for themselves,

Timetable

On the website, there should be an example timetable of our week and what activities we do on each day. It may be of use to highlight the early morning starter activities, which usually start the day in a positive way. Please note that due to lots of exciting events and activities always going on around school, the timetable is frequently subject to change. However, as a rough guide it may be of use to discuss with your child about how their day has gone.
