# Independent children

Thank you so much to everyone who took the time to send in photos and videos of their child dressing themselves independently last week. It was brilliant to see how proud the children were when sharing their photos with their peers in the classroom. The children seemed extremely eager to complete the challenge and I hope you felt the same at home too. There is a new weekly challenge listed below.

Weekly challenge – This week's challenge is a little harder but a skill that lots of children are really struggling with in the classroom. We are going to focus on additional items i.e coats and shoes. This week I would like you to turn the sleeves of your child's coat inside out and challenge them to reverse the sleeves and put their coat on zipped up as quickly as they can. Turning clothes inside out is a real challenge and might be something you practice first with other items of clothes before completing the challenge with the coat. Similarly, fastening both zips and buttons can be problematic so again this is something you might want to practice first. The next part of the challenge is…shoes! Shoes are often put on the wrong feet so I'd like this to be practiced too.

Once your child is ready, turn their coat inside out and present them with their school shoes muddled up and see how quickly they can put them on.
