Dear Parents/Carers,

This year at Madley Primary School we have introduced a new Phonics scheme called *Phonics Shed*, and in Class 1 we have started our learning at Chapter 4a. You may have already heard your children coming home talking about the different characters, sounds and actions, as well as 'Joe' our *Phonics Shed* puppet. We have started sending home Chapter 2 reading books to help consolidate the learning that happened in Class R, and as a next step the children will be given Chapter 3 reading books before moving onto Chapter 4a. This is to consolidate previous learning, and ensure they have a positive journey to becoming confident readers both at home and school, and we welcome your support to help the children in this process. Please work with your child to read for 10-15 minutes every day.

Pronunciation Guide

Below is a pronunciation guide for each sound from Chapter 2 to help you at home should you need it. This is the order in which the sounds and words are taught.

Please note that *Phonics Shed* aims to reduce the 'schwa' at the end of each sound. This is the "uh" sound. Some sounds are 'stretchy' and others are 'bouncy'. The stretchy sounds are easiest to say 'purely' and the 'bouncy' sounds sometimes cannot help but have a small 'schwa' at the end, which we should encourage to reduce as much as possible.

High Frequency Words

The children are also learning to read 'High Frequency Words' using previously taught, familiar, letter sounds. These need to be read at speed. Please note that some words can be sounded out and blended, but some of them are non-decodable, which means children will need to be told the 'tricky' part of the word that doesn't sound out 'typically'.

Home Learning

Your child should now have received a login to the *Phonics Shed* website. You can find their usernames and passwords inside the front cover of their reading diaries. As of next week, the children will be set phonics home learning via Phonics Shed. It is important that the children have a go at doing these weekly at home to support the learning we do in school. Phonics Shed is linked with Spelling Shed and the app for this can be downloaded, if you wish to, for use on tablets and mobile phones.
