## Important updates and WFH - Tuesday May 12th

Dear all.

Don't fret, worry or panic about any announcements about school re-opening for some! At the moment details are very, very sketchy and without detail. Until we have more details and clarity we won't share anything else and we are back to where we were at the beginning, acting on 'fact not fiction.'

We have lots to think about and plan for, remember it is an **'ambition**' of the government for schools to reopen for some pupils from June 1st, it is not definite or a given. It depends on the national picture as well as our own ability and staffing as a school. It is also dependent on 'if you want to send your child' as you cannot be forced and we would not punish you in any form during these unprecedented times.

You must be happy, re-assured and content that your child is safe at school (we can only 'do our best' and cannot completely guarantee anything). One thing is certain, school will not be the same as it was when your child left it and there will be procedures and aspects that will be very different for children, parents and staff (more details later in the week). You will have a thousand questions, as we do, but we don't have all of the answers yet (remember we find out information AT EXACTLY THE SAME TIME as you).

We may also be in a situation where people have to return to work and see themselves as 'key' workers and we are overwhelmed with applications. We will only consider new applications if you have **NO other alternatives and you are crucial to the fight against Covid 19.** Each individual application will be judged on its individual merit (we don't need a letter from an employer as every employer would consider their worker a key worker). Please, please think about this carefully, we understand that people are under extreme pressure and money may be a major issue but we want to operate safely.
