Dear Parents and Children,

Less content today as you had quite a lot yesterday. All of the ideas given can be adapted for all age groups. I am also forwarding tweets from our **Twitter account (@MadleyPrimarySc)** if you are Twitter and following us we are happy to see your work or videos through that platform (if parents set it up as you have to be 13!).

- <u>Scavenger hunt ideas</u> (indoor or outdoors) - adults set the rules so you don't end up with anything broken and blame me! Find things that fit the criteria given - 'something twisted' 'something that is useful' 'something with a hole in it'

Why not write your own scavenger hunt for your family (one could be indoors when the weather changes and one outdoors). You could adapt it for language - 'how many words can you find on things in the house?' ' how many words can you find that begin with 'a' or another letter?' 'how many words can you find on food packets that contain the 'ou' sound? Ultimate challenge - find words in your house/garden on packets or anywhere that go through the whole alphabet from to z!!

I will give more ideas for scavenger hunts as we progress.

- <u>Dance challenge</u> - we want to dance our way through this! You may have seen the NHS staff dancing to Olly Muirs (if you haven't then look it up on You Tube). choose a suitable uplifting song and devise a dance. You can share these on Twitter if your parents allow you.

- Slightly boring but necessary =

Times tables practise/counting practise (depending on your child's age) - 10 minutes a day. If your child is pretty quick with all of their time tables then they can do it backwards, at speed, write them on cards and make it challenging

Handwriting practise - 10 minutes a day - on paper/in sand/on water/using different pencils and pens/in mud/using mud on paper - it is the fine and big motor skills as well as the flow. From Year 4 we should be practising our joined writing to increase speed as well.

Spelling practise - 10 minutes - either Spelling Shed AND written as well - make it a game (Countdown etc).
