WFH and other news - 28th April 2020

Hello all.

I hope this finds you well. A few 'bits' of information.

School will <u>NOT</u> reopen until it is safe to do so, we have had no information (or any dates or time frame) regarding any form of reopening from either national or local sources. There has been much speculation in the media regarding schools reopening but there are no plans for this yet (I will update you when there is, although you may find out at the same time as us!). We have been planning in school for a time when school does reopen with new, covered sinks being installed outside to allow for greater hand washing capacity and also for sanitiser dispensers around the school. We cannot change the fabric of our building or the size of rooms which would significantly impact on our ability to accomodate all of the children and ensure social distancing. More news will follow in due course

<u>Class teacher updates</u> - teachers have added a new curriculum update to the class page of your child. School website then 'children' tab then 'class pages' and the 'working from home' star. Teachers have set tasks on various platforms for your children as well as paper based work. New updates of work and ideas will appear every Tuesday.

Paper packs are available in the entrance hall of school, if you can safely get there. One per child (we will keep refreshing the pile). We understand that not every child has access to a printer or a computer each so just do what you can with the resources you have available.

<u>A message for your child</u> - teachers are working in getting resources for you and giving ideas. We know it is a bit different being at home but you need to keep practising certain skills (spelling, handwriting, tables etc) and be building up knowledge of other things. We expect you to be doing some work or you will find it harder when we return to school. Try your best and do some work everyday (we recommend the morning). Try something new, work on a project and don't give your parents a hard time! Be kind, be thoughtful and be responsible.......
