Moving forward for all

- We await more news and plans from the government this week and we will continue to try to plan for everyone to 're-connect' with school (even if it is just one morning). Unfortunately if your child is eligible for school (Year R,1 and 6) then we cannot have a 'drop in' for you at the moment as it would change our 'bubbles' and we don't have the staff numbers to operate that system. We are trying to make the best of a bizarre situation. More news will follow once we know interested numbers from our simple survey and we also see what happens with numbers for Years R,1 and 6 over the next 2 weeks.
- Teachers/school adults will be making phone calls to you over the next few weeks the purpose is a quick 'catch up' and, possibly, to talk to your child. School adults are in school operating 'bubbles' as well as supervising and setting home learning so their time is limited and they will ring when they have a 'gap' in their timetables.
- <u>School reports</u> you will receive a report for the year for your child in July (it will be in the post) but there won't be a parent's evening this term.

Other news

- Over the weekend school received some worrying news as Mr Richards (he teaches construction to some of the older children) is in hospital and is now awaiting heart surgery (he only went for an ECG and wasn't ill). We wish Mr Richards, and Mrs Richards, are very best wishes at this worrying time and we hope to see him fit, well and back in school later in the year.

If you are a family who has been contacted regularly by Mrs Richards then Mrs Lee will be contacting you as Mrs Richards is not in school for the foreseeable future.

'Good luck' Mr Richards and all the very best to the whole family at this worrying time. We will keep you updated on progress after Mr Richard's operation.
