### Winter Wear!




At Madley Pre-School we really value the importance of outdoor learning and do get out and about in all weathers. It is vital that you send your child appropriately dressed for the weather and provide

### <u>Autumn Learning</u>

Our curriculum thus far has been 'All about Autumn'. We have used stories and walks in nature to engage the children in learning about the changing weather and season. They have noticed the changing colour of leaves and used this to inspire their paintings and crafts; printing with leaves and other natural resources, mixing different colours to match the leaves they have collected, creating Transient art pieces using natural resources found on our walks, using their senses to sort and explore the different textures. They have developed their mathematical skills through sorting and counting leaves, conkers and acorns, making repeat patterns with natural objects, comparing and measuring sticks, using mathematical language in their baking, sensory and mud kitchen play. They have enjoyed listening to and retelling stories, developing an understanding of beginning, middle and end. They have enjoyed learning new rhymes and songs about the days of the week and seasons, using scarves to dance in the wind and instruments to create their own music.



Outdoor play forms a big part of our day at Pre-School and is a vital part of a child's well-being. We have managed to get outside every day, in all weathers, seeing first-hand how the season has changed. They have developed their gross motor skills through large construction play; carrying and moving large equipment, building boats, buses and cars for imaginative role-play, dens and homes for toy animals. They have created obstacle courses and developed their perseverance and resilience, turn-taking and risk-taking skills, as well as negotiation and cooperation with others. They have enjoyed sweeping leaves and filling wheelbarrows. They have also developed their fine motor skills through using pipettes, funnels, scoops and jugs in their mud kitchen play, mixing and stirring mud, herbs, seeds and water to create 'hot chocolate' and other delights; hammering, 'tweezering' and scooping out pumpkin flesh and seeds to explore the inside of a pumpkin.

Throughout December we will be developing an understanding of the Nativity story through role-play, stories, songs and small world play. We will develop our fine motor skills by cutting, baking, drawing and painting to create various Christmas crafts and develop our awareness of letter shapes by writing Christmas cards, labels and letters. We will explore our understanding of 3D shapes and their properties by sorting and wrapping presents, estimating and measuring wrapping paper, string and sellotape.
