Maths

Thank you so much to all those children who are regularly logging on and completing the assignments on Education City, Spelling Shed and of course pushing themselves on TT Rockstars. It is all helping to maintain and develop their skills and knowledge whilst working from home.

I have noticed that fewer children were using Spelling Shed last week so I have kept the assignments on for a further week to give more time for them to be completed. Also, on Education City, it is important that the children complete the activities to the best of their abilities as it is not enough to just "do them" - their progress within the activity is more important.

English

Writing Task:

As last week's writing task was particularly detailed (and I completely forgot to take into account the Bank Holiday) I would like the children to focus on finishing their story and illustrations, if they haven't done so already. I am really looking forward to seeing this work at some point and hope that the children enjoyed the film and writing the story in their words.

Next week, we will be looking to write a discussion text on the use of PG and U ratings within the film industry so they could start to do some research and make some notes around this subject: why/how they came about; how they are judged; whether there are films which they disagree with the rating and why etc.

SPAG:

Following on from the work that the children completed two weeks ago, I would like them to complete **pages 30 and 31 from their SPAG book** – Writing for Your Audience. This again looks at the differences between formal and informal writing styles and will be useful for them in their writing task next week, which will be a formal text.

Reading

The answer sheet for Wild Camping (the final text from the booklet) is available on the website and this week I have assigned a **Guided Reading assessment on Education City** for the children to complete and review their answers. The format is therefore a little different but I am sure that they will be able to follow the instructions on the screen without any difficulty.

Hopefully, the children are all continuing to read on a regular basis as this is the perfect time to explore all of the wonderful books, whether fiction or non-fiction that exist. There are also lots of free online resources at the moment, which are useful if you do not have anything that grabs their interest at home.
