## **English**

As writers, I would like the children to complete three different activities this week:



**Lesson 1** "Short Burst" picture for this week.

I would like you to imagine that you are a dog/cat/hamster or indeed any domestic pet and to write about what it that you get up to when you owners are out of the house. What mischief do you cause? Where do you go in the house that you're not meant to?

In terms of the genre, this is more of a recount and therefore does not need a beginning and ending as you would with a narrative. Perhaps it is just a bit of bragging to the dog who lives next door or a moan about the fact that everybody has been at home for the last few months and you have missed doing some of your normal things. Whatever you choose to write, I would like you to make sure that you use plenty of description and detail so that the reader (hopefully, me) can actually picture the things happening.

Remember to plan some ideas before writing as much as you can for up to thirty minutes. Then, read back through your work and make any corrections that you need to do and see if you can make any changes to make it even better. If necessary, please write out in neat before emailing it in to school.

## **Lessons 2, 3 and 4**: "A letter to my younger self"

Last week I asked you to write a formal letter to your new High School so this week I would like you to write an informal letter or note but with a twist as you are writing to yourself aged five!

What would you say to yourself about what to do and not to do as you move through Primary School? What good advice could you give them? What should they avoid doing or what should they definitely make the most of doing? How could they make their experience more enjoyable?

Use the planning sheet if you wish to help you and when you have finished you can use illustrations if you wish to explain or highlight different points that you have made in your note.

I would like to put this piece of work into your theme books as your last piece of writing so please make sure you are completely happy with it in terms of content, punctuation, spelling and of course, handwriting!

As before, please ask someone to email or send both of these pieces of work into school once they are completed.

### Lesson 5: Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Focus




## **Transition to High School**

We will then collate the films to use at the end of term at whatever event is organised.
