Over the holidays I would like you to continue to think about how you could show the value of care. To do this I am setting you a challenge to carry out a good deed every day. Here are some examples below:

- Bake a cake for a friend or family member
- Write a letter to someone you care about
- Tidy and clean your bedroom
- Do the washing up at home
- Help with the shopping
- Help a sibling with their learning

<u>Outdoor Learning</u>

This week, I will be providing a range of activities in our home learning section for outdoor learning ideas. Some of these may be useful to use when you are out and about on a walk or just in your back garden. These can either be used this week or you can keep them as ideas to use during the summer holidays.

'Eco' activities to do at home.

- Grow your own vegetables. Learn what it takes to look after plants and vegetables as well as observing the lifecycle of plants first hand.
- Recycle old wellies by filling with compost and sowing seeds into them.
- Make junk models. Recycle old egg boxes, cardboard tubes, cans, cereal boxes and plastic bottles. You might produce robots, vehicles or large-scale masterpieces!
- Make a Bug Hotel using old pieces of wood, palettes or tubing.

As mathematicians

This week, we are on week 12 of the White Rose Maths. The focus is on time and reading time to the hour and half hour. At home, allow the children plenty of practise at reading the time on real clocks. <u>Session four: Story writing</u>

Can you write a sequel? What adventures might the Colour Monster have next? Think carefully about a beginning, middle and end to your story. I have provided a story plan incase you need to think about your ideas first.

As Designers

<u>Using the story of The Colour</u> <u>Monster' as inspiration can you:</u>

- Make large-scale models of the colour monster when he is different colours. You could use recycled materials to make your colour monster.
- Create your own Colour Monster puppets and use these to put on a show.

As Artists

<u>Using the story of the colour monster as your inspirations:</u>

- Can you mix colours? What new colours can you make?
- Try using paint to mix different shades of the same colour.
- Draw your own picture of the Colour Monster.
- The little girl puts the Colour Monster's feelings into separate jars. Can you draw things that make you happy/ angry/sad etc.
- Practice drawing faces that show different emotions. Can you draw a happy face? Can you draw an angry face? Use a mirror to see how your facial expression can change to show emotions.
