There are two main activities and one short one this week as there are some who feel that they could manage more reading practise. Worms and How Weeds Get Everywhere can be found in the Home Learning section on our class page on the school website. There are 3 levels of difficulty for both activities. There is no requirement to print these out. You could write answers down in a notebook if you have one. If all of the three reading levels are too challenging it is still really valuable to read to your child and work together on the answers.

Science

As scientists...

Try this simple, colourful experiment that demonstrates the capillary action in plants using just kitchen roll, food colouring and water. Click on the link below to find the instructions.

The capillary action is a clever trick that plants use to transport water from their roots, up the stem and through to the rest of the plant. In order to transport the water, the plant first has to overcome gravity by creating forces that pull the water upwards and through the plant.
