Maths

There are many great games here for practising times tables fluency. By the end of Year 2 the children are expected to know 10x, 2x, 5x, 4x, 3x and 6x.

Try:

Hit the Button - Times Tables and Division Facts

Mental Maths Train – Multiplication and Division

Please also revisit the times table recording sheet which is designed to help you monitor which facts for each times table your child is struggling with. This should help you to decide which times table to practise! There are so many games on here which will reinforce different key skills. Some of our favourites are:

Place Value Basket Ball, Caterpillar Ordering, Coconut Ordering, Chinese Dragon Game, Post Sorting, Coconut Odd or Even, Shark Numbers, Daily Ten, Blast Off, Coconut Multiples, Toy Shop Money Game, Pay Using One Coin, Cuddly Toy Sale, Shape Patterns, Symmetry Matching, Symmetry Sorting, Hickory Dickory Clock.

Spelling

This is a good opportunity to spend some time learning the words that the children are expected to learn during Year 2. They are called the 'Common Exception Words for Year 2' and can be found online as well as in your Homework Book! Try choosing 10 words a day to check which ones you know already and which need to be learned.

Please also use Spelling Shed to practise and revise spellings from previous weeks as well as any new lists, which will be added. The lists that have been created for them can be found under the 'My Lists' section as always. The children can also use any of the games for the lists in Stage 1 and 2. Some of the Stage 1 spellings could definitely do with a revisit!

Other ideas for the children to complete are;

A weather diary. They can draw weather symbols for each day and write a sentence describing the conditions.

A weather report. The children to watch a weather forecast from the television and then write their own. They can then perform this to an audience.

Weather collage. Take photos of different weather conditions and print them off. Using these create a collage.

Weather acrostic poem. Children to create a poem using the letters of the word weather.

Design and make a weather station. Using the knowledge of previous work children can build their own weather station including rain gauges, sundials, windsocks and weather vanes.

Design and make their own water cycle. Children have done this in school and therefore should remember how to construct it.

Compose and write their own weather music. Using improvised and tuned instruments children can interpret particular weather conditions including rainstorms.

Children research and write down different myths and legends associated with weather.

Children choose different animals from each continent and describe the climate that they have to survive living in.

Children design and build a weather board game using different weather symbols, language and conditions
