English

Spelling

There are two new tasks for Spelling on Spelling Shed – a group of new words and a group of common exception words to revise and practise. <u>Common Exception Words 4th May</u> – door, poor, floor, great, break, steak, even, hour, money, pretty.

<u>Contractions 4th May</u> – The apostrophe shows where a letter or letters would be if the word was written in full. See words in the text box below.

What about....writing your words in a rainbow pattern, making your words out of playdoh, painting your words, writing them with a paintbrush and water outside on a patio slab or on something similar?

We have published the complete list of Common Exception Words on the home learning section on the Class 2 page on the school website. This lists all of the words that the children should be able to read and spell before they leave primary school. If you are having difficulty with the level of the spellings that are on Spelling Shed please have a look at the words on List 1 and choose some of those to work on each week. If you are finding them too easy and you are confident that you can read and spell every word on List 2 then begin on List 3.

Theme

The task this week is to learn a little bit about King Henry VIII. On the BBC bitesize website look for KS1-History -Monarchs and Leaders. Please watch the first animation clip and then complete the animated activity below it. You could have a go at making your own timeline of King Henry's life using the statements found on the website www.teachingideas.co.uk. Once on the website search for Henry VIII timeline to find the statements. They are also on our home learning section on the Class 2 webpage.

Science

This week the tasks are found on the website Explorify-explorify.wellcome.ac.uk/blog/explorify-at-home-plants. Children can watch the video clip which is all about seed germinating and if possible have a go at the hands on activity. There is a second video clip and activity below about rainfall and plants which is also useful. Then visit the BBC bitesize daily website and watch the program titled 'Plants facts and painting.' This starts with a bit of PE with Super Movers and then there is a 10 minute section which is about plants. After you've watched this you could write 5 facts about plants. Try using bullet points for each fact.
