Maths

The pollination process

You can choose to cut out existing sentences to order, fill in the gaps or complete the sentences all linked to pollination. The link above should have helped you. You choose which activity to try but try but make it challenging!

Writing

This week your writing challenge is to try to write a traditional tale from this weeks' short burst picture. Plan it a little bit at a time. Some planning sheets are on the class page to help, including a storyboard if drawing the story helps you. You decide what is best for you.

Lesson 1 - Mr Batstone's short burst challenge from WFH update. The building from the short burst is the setting for the story. Who lives there? What are they like? Can you describe them? Write a short description of the setting and the character who lives there. Draw them if it helps. Make it interesting, using adjectives and similes to give a visual image to somebody else using **Description**.

Lesson 2 - Think about a problem that the character could have in the village or the house? Is there an evil character in the village that has a problem with them? Which they manage to solve with a bit of a struggle? (Think traditional tale, Little Red Riding Hood, Three Little Pigs etc). Think about the **Action** (what happens).

Lesson 3. Do the characters speak to each other? What do they say? Remember inverted commas https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/z7s6t39 Write some sentences down between the characters with the correct punctuation. Think **Dialogue**.

Lesson 4/5 - Now you are ready to put it all together. Remember DAD? (Description, Action, Dialogue) Use DAD to structure your writing from the ideas you've put down. An example is on the class page to help you.

Finally, during this difficult and unprecedented time, I hope you; your child/children and close family members remain safe and well.
