

This weeks' questions to research

Why do animals have a skeleton? What would happen if we did not have a skeleton?

You can use the internet to find out or you may even be lucky enough to have some books or an encyclopaedia.

To try: Common bone names word grid

On the WFH page is a common word grid of the bone name. But can you work out which they are commonly known as? See if you can find out and present your findings in some way. It could be a drawing with labels? Or even make a matching cards game.

As a reader

Reading Comprehension

As a musician

When we listen to music we often find ourselves with a picture in our head of what the music is representing or what story it is telling. The challenge is great either as an artist create a piece of art inspired by music or as a musician create a piece of music linked to art. Be creative, have fun and enjoy the challenge.

This week why not try the symmetrical observational drawing? I'm certainly going to have a go in my art journal this week.

As a writer

Lesson 1 - Short burst challenge. See Mr Batstone's update for ideas or write a short newspaper report about why the man is wearing PPE for feeding llamas!

Lesson 2 - Bubbles can be really fun and amazing things. You are an author, in fact a poet and will write a poem to show to other children in and out of school that bubbles are not bad things. You will not believe some of the bubbles in this video from a bubble artist. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QseWXpkaGTY While watching, make a note of as many words linked to bubbles as you can. Can you think of any more words especially verbs (actions)? e.g. floating, bursting etc

Lesson 3 - Now you have your words build them into verses. Even think about adding some adverbs too. Experiment with the lines. It doesn't have to rhyme. It could be an acrostic poem. Just remember to entertain the reader e.g. Bubbles floating gracefully or even longer Bubbles floating gracefully through the beautiful sky.

Lesson 4 - Handwriting practise. It is important to keep practising joining and writing neatly. You will find some more practice on the WFH page.

Lesson 5 - Reading comprehension on Garden Birds.

<u>Theme - Battlefields</u>

As a historian, order the key events of WW2 on a timeline. In history, it is important to understand historical events using date on a timeline. There are some key events from WW2 on the WFH page. Your challenge is to cut them and order them. If you are lucky enough to have A3 paper it will stick on there. If you do not, as you can order them on a table and take a photo to record it.
