As of last Monday, we are now in a new term, which means a new theme 'Battlefields'. I have added some websites and challenges for this theme.

Some of the home learning activities set will be related to this as well as some maths and writing. As in previous weeks, some weekly online activities have been set on Education City (under homework, please guide your children to see if need), Spelling Shed and TT Rockstars. You will continue to be notified by parent mail of other ideas in the daily working from home (WFH) update. Together it should give you lots of ideas for you to explore and try. The expectation is to try to use as many of the activities as possible, while still making it workable for you in your own way. Keep to a daily structure to help you to achieve this.

Maths

Last week I gave a link to White Rose Maths (WRM) who have developed a detailed home learning programme. If possible, I would like your child to work with an adult or perhaps an older sibling each day to have a go at the lessons. There will be a video each day.

These lessons follow a sequence we would at school however, very often we find we need to spend more time on some areas and we also find we have to revise previous before moving on so if you feel your child needs to look back at previous years learning then click on the year group and use those resources. Also, please do not feel you have to do each point of the video or the whole sheet each day. At this difficult time, we are all trying to do what is best and it is better that your child is doing their work and feeling successful than avoiding it because it is difficult. Reinforcing and practising what they know is very valuable. There are lessons available from Year 1 to Year 3 that you can access. From this week onwards, the maths activities in Education City link to last weeks' WRM lessons as this will allow me to monitor progress. For this coming week the maths activities on Education City are all related to equivalent fractions, comparing and ordering fractions and fractions on a number line.

How weeds get everywhere comprehension

This weeks' question to research

What does a plant need to live? Can you write an explanation to say what it needs? On the WFH page is a scientific vocabulary poster to help you.

Writing

Lesson 1 - short burst. It was nice to see the short burst that was sent in last week. Use what Mr Batstone sent you to help writing for 20 minutes. Remember to plan for 5 - 10 minutes before writing your newspaper. Fold the page to make columns if you like to make it more real.

Lesson 2 - Using the information you have found out about plants (what they are and how they live) plan an explanation text. Note down some subheadings you may want to use and ideas for a title.

Lesson 3/4 - Now you have your ideas, make success criteria of what you will include, and then write your title and introduction. Continue through as much as you can. If you are struggling for subheadings just use the two questions, 'What is a plant? What does a plant need to live?'

Lesson 5 - Add a labelled diagram of a plant with their parts if you wish. Can you label the stem, root, trunk, leaves and flower?
