Class 4 Curriculum Update 'Working from home' 30th March 2020

I hope this update finds you well and safe. Hopefully, now that you have had a week of 'working at home' you have been able to establish a routine, which provides you with a good balance of school work for practising skills, exercise and quality time with your family, where you get to have fun and enjoy this unusual time.

In addition to still working on the ideas from the previous update and the pack you were sent home with (if you were in school on the last day), this update will provide you with a project that we were going to complete in school over the next week.

Design your own theme park

You will find the associated sheets for this project on our class page (below the update). Your challenge is to design your own theme park and work out how much this would cost to run.

It suggests a Lunar Theme Park but if you have better ideas, and I know that you do, please design your own with a theme of your interest - Lego, dinosaurs, LOL, it can be anything. I know you will have much better ideas.

The expectation is that you complete the following steps:

- 1. Draw the plan of your theme park using the costing sheets to help you decide what to include.
 - 2. Cost out your theme park using the sheets provided.
 - 3. Design and make a poster to advertise your theme park.
 - 4. Design and make a leaflet to persuade people to visit your theme park.
- 5. Build some of your ride or your whole theme park using Lego (or other materials you have at home).

NOTE: Some children will be able to access the figures given on the sheet. Others may need these figures adjusted because they are learning to count in 2's or 10's for example. Please adjust the numbers to suit your child so that they can complete it independently or keep the numbers and make it a family project!

Spelling Shed: 15 minutes per day is expected. Assignments have been set and I have been checking your progress daily. Reading: at least 20 minutes per day is expected. Keep recording your reads in your reading diary too. Complete a book review to share with your friends. I will put some examples on the class page that can be printed off or you could design your own. Why not build a reading den or snug so you have a nice space to enjoy a book.
