

Lesson 2: We are going to use the book Flotsam as inspiration this week. It is a wonderful picture book. Before you start, what do you think Flotsam means?

If you don't watch the video, you can still complete this week's work using the resources. Then as a reader, complete one of the observe, wonder and infer grids for the picture of An underwater world that you like most. You will hopefully remember doing one of these in school. In the observe box, write all the things you can see in the illustration. In the wonder box, write yourself questions. Think what don't I know but really would like to know about the image. Then in the infer box make inferences by starting your sentences with I think or Maybe.



Lesson 3: Using the picture you chose yesterday, plan a description for it. Write as many interesting words as you can to describe the scene in the picture. Can you use any of the words of the week from previous updates? What adjectives are best? Plan some expanded noun phrases, similes and metaphors. Make a list of the best ones to create atmosphere when describing.

Lesson 4: Write your description. Refer to your planning sheet and notes. The more notes you made, the better your writing will be. Really challenge yourself with your vocabulary choices.

Lesson 5: Design, draw and colour your own page for the book. What underwater world will you design? What will your creatures be doing? Then list 10 sentences that include expanded noun phrases that could be used in a description of your page. Be creative with this.
